In our active lives, we'll find new ways to care for the earth &amp; the poor.</p>	<p><b>13</b> Pope Francis reminds us: <i>"Living our vocation to be protectors of God's handiwork is essential to a life of virtue; it is not an optional or secondary aspect of our Christian experience."</i> (LS 217) .</p>	<p><b>14 Ash Wednesday</b> <i>"The ecological crisis is ...a summons to profound interior conversion."</i> Pope Francis</p> 	<p><b>15 Nature</b> reveals to us the hand of God. Take time each day to make it part of your prayer. Notice new life budding, the intricate patterns of a plant, the sounds of different birds, the changes in a tree, the sound of water.</p>	<p><b>16</b> As a prayer, watch a section of <b>"The Letter: A Message for Our Earth"</b> each week, on YouTube. Tell your NYS reps to support it.</p>	<p><b>23</b> The <b>NY Bigger Better Bottle Bill</b>, (S237/A6353) ups bottle deposits to 10 cents to keep plastic out of the waste stream. It helps the bottle collectors and helps the planet. Tell your NYS reps to support it.</p>	<p><b>24 Nature needs our advocacy.</b> Since the Endangered Species Act of 1973 passed, 99% of the species deemed "endangered" have been saved. Yet, the rate of extinction is far greater now, says the EPA.</p>

After you've got that down, start another habit to build up gradually &amp; not get overwhelmed.</p>	<p><b>5 Take the plastic bag ban seriously.</b> Stores have resorted to "reusable plastic" bags that are heavier &amp; rarely get reused. You'd have to reuse them 17 times to match their production emissions with a cotton one.</p>	<p><b>6 "There is no such a thing as 'away'. When we throw away, it must go somewhere."</b> - Annie Leonard</p> 	<p><b>7</b> Ask yourself if you really need the newest model of <b>electronic gadgets...</b> cell phones, computers, TVs etc. Use them as long as they function. If buying new ones, recycle or donate the old ones. Look for store buy-back policies.</p>	<p><b>8 Haven't switched?</b> Get a renewable source of electricity. Your building can switch. The utility company delivers the energy &amp; bills you. In NYS, compare companies at <b>Power To Choose</b> <a href="http://www.documents.dps.ny.gov/PTC">www.documents.dps.ny.gov/PTC</a></p>	<p><b>9 Skip the Stuff: Educate your favorite take-out places:</b> It's now against the law for NYC restaurants to give single-use plastic utensils, straws and condiments with take-out unless you request it. Before throwing away or buying, make it a spiritual practice to think about the <b>sustainability R's</b>: refuse, reduce, reuse, repurpose, &amp; recycle.</p>	<p><b>12</b> Use the <b>IRA Savings Calculator</b> to estimate savings available from the Inflation Reduction Act tax breaks and subsidies to electrify your home's heat/a.c., stoves, hot water, &amp; car bit.ly/ira-calculator</p>	<p><b>13</b> <i>"Will you be on the right side of history? <p><b>17 CRY OF THE EARTH &amp; CRY OF THE POOR</b> <i>"It is necessary to be honest &amp; recognize that the most effective solutions will not come from individual efforts alone, but... from major political decisions on the national &amp; international level."</i> (LD69)</p>	<p><b>18</b> With the large influx of <b>migrants seeking refuge</b> in our cities, it is too easy to blame them rather than look at the conditions in their countries that impel them to leave. Try to be an ally and see what you can do to support them.</p>	<p><b>19</b> The U.S. is the largest exporter of fossil fuel "natural" gas globally, &amp; exports it in the form of <b>Liquid Natural Gas, LNG</b>. Join efforts to pressure banks to stop funding LNG terminals that export polluting gas &amp; hurt the poor.</p>	<p><b>20</b> <b>Divesting</b> is an economic justice tool; it helped end apartheid. It can help us transition off the fossil fuel economy. We can withdraw our personal savings from coal, oil, and gas. Money talks!</p>	<p><b>21</b> <b>We deface the earth</b> to extract resources. Spend time praying with photos of tarsands in Alberta, mountain top removal in West Virginia, or oil flaring in Nigeria, to see the impacts of extraction.</p>	<p><b>22</b> <b>World Water Day. Take the Water Challenge.</b> Drink water instead of non-water drinks for 2 weeks; give money saved to a water protection organization or a water project in a poor community.
